Fun Facts:

- The Catholic Bible is composed of 73 books while the Protestant Bibles are composed of 66 books.
- This was done by Martin Luther in 1517 when he nailed his 95 Theses to the door in Wittenberg Germany.
- It is chronological and like every good piece of work contains the 4 elements that make it enticing to readers.
- Those 4 elements are: Foundation, a significant loss of some sort, a Christ-like figure (and in the case of the Bible, Christ Himself), and conclusive ending.
- Foundation: Genesis and the creation story, building up of the Jewish people and their exile into slavery in Egypt etc.
- Significant Loss: In the Bible this one aspect has many, many stories of significant loss but for sake of our Christ figure let us use the aspect of the loss of Heaven with the Original Sin.
- Christ-like figure: this one should be fairly obvious.
- Conclusive ending: Now the Bible is one of the only pieces of work that has a conclusive ending but is still vague. The fact that the ending in the Bible hasn't happened yet is one of the main reasons for its enticement.
- The Bible can be broken down into subcategories that are very helpful in studying and learning from it:

- Old Testament
(under OT there are 4 subs.)
1. Law (5)
 2. Historical Books (16)
 3. Wisdom Books (7)
 4. Prophetic Books (18)

- New Testament
(under NT there are 6 subs.)
1. Gospels (4)
 2. History (1)
 3. Paul's Letters to Churches (9)
 4. Paul's Letters to Friends (4)
 5. General Letters (8)
 6. Apocalyptic Book (1)

In total the Bible has 73 books, 46 being contained in the OT and 27 in the NT.
